- From 2016 to 2021, jobs declined by 3.8% in Hartford-East Hartford-Middletown, CT from 676,347 to 650,844. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 0.7% by 4.5%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 66.4% to 66.0% between 2016 and 2021.
- Concerning educational attainment, 22.3% of Hartford-East Hartford-Middletown, CT residents possess a Bachelor's Degree (2.0% above the national average), and 8.6% hold an Associate's Degree (0.1% below the national average).
- The top three industries in 2021 are Insurance Carriers, Restaurants and Other Eating Places, and Education and Hospitals (Local Government).






Unemployment by Gender



Unemployment by Ethnicity







Job Trends






Hartford-East Hartford-Middletown, CT had a March 2022 unemployment rate of 4.15%, decreasing from 4.35% 5 years before.






Millennials

Hartford-East Hartford-Middletown, CT has 232,178 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 247,594.



The national average for an area this size is 483,937 racially diverse people, while there are 415,250 here.




Veterans








Top Industry Location Quotient










