Median household income is \$454 below the national median household income of \$62.8K.

#### **Takeaways**

- As of 2021 the region's population increased by 0.4% since 2016, growing by 6,142. Population is expected to increase by 0.5% between 2021 and 2026, adding 8,672.
- From 2016 to 2021, jobs declined by 3.6% in Milwaukee-Waukesha, WI from 900,860 to 868,067. This change fell short of the national growth rate of 0.7% by 4.3%. As the number of jobs declined, the labor force participation rate decreased from 66.1% to 65.2% between 2016 and 2021.
- Concerning educational attainment, **23.6% of Milwaukee-Waukesha, WI residents possess a Bachelor's Degree** (3.3% above the national average), and **8.9% hold an Associate's Degree** (0.2% above the national average).
- The top three industries in 2021 are Restaurants and Other Eating Places, General Medical and Surgical Hospitals, and Education and Hospitals (Local Government).

#### **Educational Attainment**













#### **Job Trends**





### **Unemployment Rate Trends**


Milwaukee-Waukesha, WI had a March 2022 unemployment rate of 3.59%, increasing from 3.50% 5 years before.




#### **Millennials**

Milwaukee-Waukesha, WI has 327,061 millennials (ages 25-39). The national average for an area this size is 325,117.




#### **Retiring Soon**

Racial diversity is low in Milwaukee-Waukesha, WI. The national average for an area this size is 635,462 racially diverse people, while there are 543,100 here.




#### **Veterans**











# **Educational Pipeline**

In 2020, there were 20,960 graduates in Milwaukee-Waukesha, WI. This pipeline has shrunk by 1% over the last 5 years.
