### Introduction


- Based in Chicago's Little Village neighborhood

## **Getting the Lead Out**

- Chicago has over 400,000 lead service lines providing drinking water to residents
- There is no safe level of lead in drinking water
- From 2021-2023, the city replaced
  ~4,500 lead service lines
- One recent study indicated that racial inequities exist in the city for childhood lead exposure and water testing

## **Mapping Stakeholders**



### **Key Audience: Water Advocates**

### • Goal:

 Create data tool that can support advocacy to remove lead service lines and protect water customers from unsafe drinking water

### • Major question:

• Where are lead service lines in the city located?

### • Secondary questions:

- What are the public health impacts of the current state of lead in drinking water?
- What communities need additional water testing and filter distribution services?



- Two geographic levels: Community Area and Ward
- Public data included American Community Survey and Chicago Health Atlas
- Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests were used for access to the Chicago Department of Water Management's Service Line Inventory and
  - Lead Service Line Replacement Program data





Lead service lines are the main culprit of lead exposure in drinking water. Over 400,000 lead service lines continue to provide water to Chicagoans.



Communities with larger populations of color experience higher rates of lead poisoning



### **Design Considerations**

- Tableau Story allows for narrative in combination with interactivity
  - Progression of visualizations drills down what communities are affected most
  - Users interested in specific community areas/wards can hover over or highlight those geographies
- Default view provides visualization of FOIA'd dataset
- Possibility of quick future updates with new data

## **Ongoing Work**

- Tableau Story requires more feedback and editing before publication on LVEJO's website
  - Share with partner organizations for their feedback and use
- Spanish translation to assure language accessibility
- Promote through newsletter, social media, and LVEJO events



### **Final Reflections**

- Learned the do's-and-don'ts of submitting FOIA requests
- Gained appreciation for working with large datasets and how arduous data cleaning can be
- Centering the needs of my key audience meant this tool is not complete, but will have more of an impact once it is
